



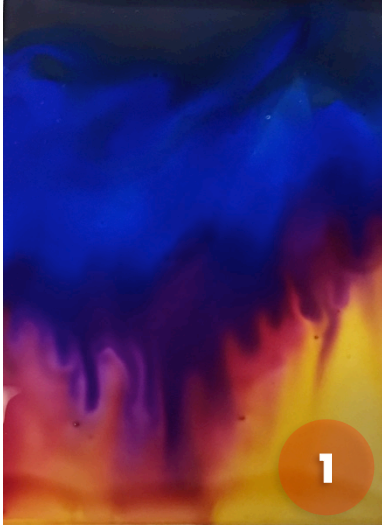
Lesson Plan – Night Sky Splendor

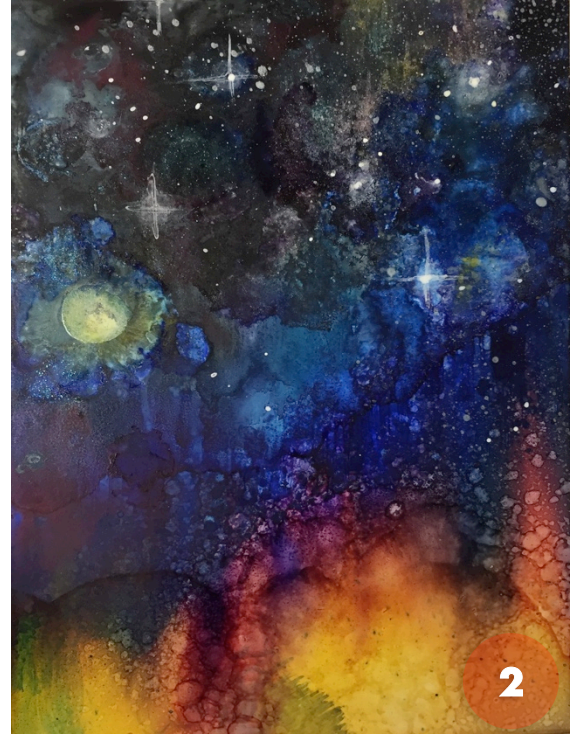
Capture the mysteries of the night sky at sunset with this uniquely layered mixed media art panel. Use photos you can find online for inspiration.

SUPPLIES

- Marabu Alcohol Inks, Rainbow Additive and Extender
- Art Sprays
- Porcelain & Glas Painter pen – white
- Opaque white film, frisket film (Grafix)
- Trees printed on clear adhesive inkjet film
- Double-side tape, rubbing alcohol, brushes
- Board, spray bottle, skewer, craft knife, ruler



Tape some opaque white film to cover the board. Squirt alcohol ink extender randomly across entire film. Drop dark inks across the top of the board and tilt to spread the colors as desired. Add medium shades, then brighter colors beneath to create a horizon line. Reapply the extender to keep the inks flowing. Spritz alcohol on a stiff brush and flick it over the surface to make stars.



Trim frisket film to mask off the brighter colors. Add a fine mist of complementary Art Spray colors across the sky, darker at the top and lighter at the bottom. Blend colors as desired with a damp brush. Experiment with rubbing alcohol and Rainbow Additive to create interesting iridescent effects and let dry. Add white dots with the Porcelain & Glass Painter. Pull out “rays” with the tip of a skewer to make bright stars. Draw a moon, too!



Peel backing away from your printed adhesive film and position trees on top of your painted sky. Burnish and trim the edges as needed.
